With fresh energy, the board of directors expanded the camp's land and transformed it into a full sleepaway camp open to all. Today, we're proud to offer a variety of programs, from day camps to overnight options, designed to keep each camper engaged and excited.

Our dedicated staff undergo a rigorous selection process, ensuring they align with our core values and commitment to youth development. It is this group of passionate individuals who create the amazing moments and lasting memories for each camper. Clothing & Packing Guidelines

- Campers should dress comfortably in clothes they would wear for play at home.
- Pack old, comfortable clothing that can get dirty or stained—no need to buy new clothes!
- Ensure all items are labeled with your camper's name (clothes, boots, hats, flashlight, toothbrush, etc.) to avoid mix-ups.
- For hikes & All Camp Games: Pants are necessary for comfort and safety.
- For activities like the Climbing Tower & Giant Swing: **Shorts should be at least mid-length** for maximum comfort when harnessed.
- Pack comfortable shoes and weather-appropriate layers to be prepared for all activities.
- Let's work together to ensure your camper has a positive, respectful, and adventure-filled experience!

Day Camp

Packing for Day Camp

Each day a camper should arrive wearing closed toe closed heel shoes camp with a backpack full of:

Change of clothing

Sunscreen and Bug

- Jacket or sweater

Spray

Swimsuit and Towel

Water Bottle and Hat

Daily Drop-Off

For day camp programs,

- Try It Day Camp:
 - o Monday Thursday: 8:30 am 9:00 am
 - Friday: 8 am 8:30 am
- Primary Day Camp:
 - o Tuesday Friday: 8:30 9 am
- 8:8 programs
 - Sunday drop off 3:30 4:00 pm
 - o Monday Friday drop off 8 am

Upon arrival, sign in by the tuck shop. We will conduct a quick lice check, and then staff will take your camper to their group.

Daily Pick-Up

At pick-up, please meet a Leadership Staff member on the basketball court. They will verify your **photo ID** against our approved pick-up list. Once confirmed, you can sign out your child. A radio call will notify the group of your arrival, and a Camp Leader will escort your child to meet you.

 - Thursday: 8:00 pm 8:30 pm (unless staying overnight)
- Primary Day Camp:

^{*}If you registered for the early morning option, drop-off starts at **7:30 am**, with **breakfast served** at 8:00 am.

- Pick-up is between **3:45 pm 4:30 pm**.
- 8:8 programs (times will be confirmed based on week your camper is attending)
 - o Sunday 9 pm
 - o Monday Thursday 8 -8:30 pm
 - o Friday: 11:30 12:15 pm

Try It Day Camp – Optional Overnight

On Thursday evening, campers in **Try It Day Camp** will have the exciting option to experience a "mini overnight" camp. For those not staying overnight, pick-up will be Thursday evening.

All campers are invited to join us for a **Pancake Breakfast** on Friday morning at **8:30 am**—a perfect way to start the day before we continue the fun!





Teddy Bear Picnic – Primary Day Camp

On Thursday, campers in **Primary Day Camp** will participate in our **Teddy Bear Picnic** event. We encourage campers to dress according to the theme and bring their favorite stuffed animal or bear to camp. Watch your email for more details!



Arriving at Sleepaway Camp

Arriving at camp can feel exciting and maybe a little daunting, but we're here to make the process as smooth and welcoming as possible! On the first day of your camper's session—typically a **Sunday**, unless otherwise noted—drop-off is scheduled between **3:30 and 4:00 pm**.

(primary camp, drop off will be Tuesday Morning)

To ensure a smooth check-in, families will go through **four quick stations** where our staff will double-check important details and help your camper settle in.

Stop 1 – Official Drop-Off (Front Gate Table)

At this station, we will:

- Confirm your contact and emergency contact details
- Ask if there are any last-minute updates we should know
- Sign your camper in for their stay

Stop 2 – Medical Check-In (Rotary House)

If your camper has **any prescription or over-the-counter medications** or **health concerns**, you'll stop here to meet the **Camp Medic**.

At this station, we will:

- Collect and review all medications (must be in bubble packs)
- Discuss any health updates or recent concerns
- Confirm over-the-counter medication permissions

Please be open and honest with our Medic so we can provide the best care and support for your camper throughout the week.

Stop 3 - Cabin Visit

Time to meet your camper's **Camp Leaders!** They will:

- Complete a quick lice check
- Answer any last-minute questions and get to know your camper
- Help your camper find their labeled bed and settle in

Once your camper is comfortable, it's time to say your "Goodbye" or "See Ya Later!". We kindly ask that parents depart by 4:00 pm so we can smoothly transition into our camp programming and begin building our camp community.

Stop 4 – Mail & Tuck Shop

On your way out, you'll have the opportunity to:

- Drop off **labeled & dated mail** for your camper
- Leave **Tuck Shop money** (in a labeled ziploc bag or envelope with your camper's name and amount) or confirm that you've sent an **e-transfer** prior to the camp start date

 (info@camptamarack.ca state childs name, camp attending and amount in the notes)

Departing from Sleepaway Camp

Photo id is required for pick-up

The departure process follows a similar structure to drop-off, ensuring a smooth and organized check-out. Upon arrival, you'll receive a **sign-out slip** that requires **three signatures**—one from **Stop 1**, **Stop 2**, **and Stop 3**—to confirm that all steps have been completed.

Before leaving camp, you will turn in this sign-out slip at the driveway, where a staff member will double-check that you have the correct camper(s) with you.

Stop 1 – Official Sign-Out (Front Gate Table)

At this station, we will:

- Verify your photo ID and match it to the approved pick-up list in your camper's file
- Sign out your camper

Stop 2 – Medical Check-Out (Rotary House)

All guardians must stop by the **Medical Room**, where the **Camp Medic** will:

- Return any remaining medication
- Provide updates on any first aid incidents or medical visits during camp

Stop 3 - Cabin Check-Out

Head back to your camper's cabin to:

- **Gather their belongings** Please take a moment to double-check their bags and **look under bunks** to ensure nothing is left behind
- Chat with your camper's Camp Leader

Stop 4 – Lost & Found

Before leaving, check the **Lost & Found table** for any misplaced items. **Any unclaimed items will be held until the end of summer and then donated.**

Stop 5 - Tuck Shop

If your camper had **remaining Tuck Shop money**, stop by to:

• Pick up their remaining balance and receipt

Time to Head Home!

Once all check-out steps are complete, turn in your **signed check-out slip** at the driveway. A staff member will confirm that you have the right camper(s), and then you're all set to head home!

Thank you for being part of Camp Tamarack—we hope to see your camper again next summer!



Homeloneliness

It's completely normal for campers to miss home. In most cases, these feelings **fade quickly** as they become engaged in camp activities.

If your camper struggles to adjust, our **Leadership Team will reach out** to learn more about their home routine and discuss strategies to help them succeed. **Rest assured—your child is safe and supported!** There is no need to rush to camp to pick them up.

Our process typically includes:

Encouraging campers with photos or letters from home

Checking in with parents the following day

Keeping campers engaged in fun, age-appropriate activities

Before camp, talk to your camper about home loneliness and reassure them that they are strong, capable, and ready for this adventure! Let them know how proud you are of them and remind them of all the fun they'll have.

With a little preparation, your camper will be set up for an incredible, confidence-boosting experience at Camp Tamarack. We can't wait to welcome them!

Good-Byes can be tough but keeping them **short and positive** makes the transition smoother for you, your camper, and their Camp Leader. The sooner campers can jump into camp life, the easier it will be for them to adjust and start having fun!

Let your camper **unpack their own belongings and make their own bed**—this is an important step in building confidence and independence. Many parents feel guilty about leaving quickly, but in our experience, **brief and upbeat good-byes** help campers settle in faster.

If you have any last-minute questions, our staff are happy to help! However, we encourage parents to gently encourage campers to join their group and start engaging in activities.

O Use positive, reassuring messages like:

- "You're going to have such a great time!"
- "What a great opportunity to meet new friends!"

Avoid saying things like:

"I'll come pick you up if it doesn't go well."

Instead, show confidence in them and their ability to have a great experience!



Birthdays at Camp

Birthdays are **special at Camp Tamarack**, and we love celebrating them! We do our best to be aware of important dates, but we **recommend confirming** your camper's birthday with us at drop-off.

We also want to **respect your camper's comfort level** when it comes to celebrating. Please let us know:

Would they enjoy a full camp sing-along and a birthday cake?

Would they prefer a quieter, more private acknowledgment?

We are happy to accommodate whatever makes your camper's birthday feel **special and comfortable**.

The Camp Program

At Camp Tamarack, we believe a **well-rounded camp experience** includes a mix of **educational, social, and recreational** activities. We also recognize the importance of **camper choice**, allowing them to explore their interests, build independence, and grow in confidence.

Our goal is to offer **fun**, **creative**, **and safe** programs that meet the guidelines and standards of the **Alberta Camping Association**.

Daily Schedule

☐ Please note: The schedule is a guide—sometimes, we adjust activities or times based on group needs, weather, or special events.

Arrival Day (Typically Sunday)

After parents depart, campers will:

☑ Rotate Through Fun Activities

- Group Development Activities Team-building games to help campers get to know one another.
- **Colour Group Expectations** Campers work together to set expectations for their group, with guidance from Camp Leaders.
- ☑ Enjoy the First Camp Meal A chance to settle in and start making friends!

☑ Tie Dye, Opening Campfire & Ceremonies

- Tie-Dye Each camper receives a white Camp Tamarack t-shirt and creates their own tie-dye design.
- Campers will meet the staff, learn about camp traditions, and share their experiences.
- We introduce **Camp Tamarack's values** and what to expect for the week.

✓ End the Day with Reflection & Cabin Time

- Evening snack
- Cabin chat to discuss the day and the week ahead

A Typical Camp Day

☀ Morning:

- 7:40 am Wake up (with music playing throughout camp!)
- 8:10 am Morning Circle (daily announcements & a short activity)
- 8:30 am Breakfast
- 9:00 am Cabin clean-up & group chores (rotates daily)
- 9:30 am 11:45 am Morning activity rotations (some pre-set, some camper choice)
- 11:45 am 12:30 pm Team Choice Time (free play)
- 12:30 pm Lunch

Afternoon:

- 1:15 pm 2:15 pm Hi/Med/Low Energy Activity Time
 - Options may include:
 - Quiet activities Card games, puzzles, coloring, reading, or rest
 - Active play Games or outdoor activities for campers with extra energy
- 2:00 pm 5:30 pm Option or specialized camp program sessions
- 5:30 pm Dinner

Evening:

- 6:30 pm 7:30 pm Optional activity period
- 7:30 pm 8:30 pm All Camp Experience (ACE)
- 8:30 pm Evening snack, cabin chat, & cabin time
 - Campers are encouraged to shower at least twice per week (or more if needed!)

Departure Day (Final Day of Camp)

The last morning follows a **normal camp routine** (wake-up, Morning Circle, breakfast).

After breakfast:

Colour Group Photo – Campers gather for one final group picture with their Colour Group to capture memories of their time at camp.

Final Large Group Game or Talent Show – Depending on the camp program, campers will either participate in a fun, high-energy group game or showcase their talents in a Stage & Studio Talent Show.

Following these activities:

- Arts & crafts projects are returned
- **Cabin clean-up & packing** Campers **double-check their belongings** before placing outside the cabin for pick-up. Any **extras go to Lost & Found**.

At pick-up, you'll receive a **Tuck Shop receipt** showing your camper's purchases.

Tuck Balance Refund

At pick-up, you'll have the option to:

- Receive the remaining balance back or
- Donate it to the **Campership Fund** (helping campers who need financial assistance attend camp).

Health Care



Medication Policy

For safety reasons, all medications (except life-saving meds) are kept with our Camp Medic.

Life-Saving Medications (Epi-pens, Inhalers, etc.)

- Campers must always keep these with them.
- If you do not have a fanny pack, Camp will provide a waist pack to store them securely.

Prescription Medications

- Must be bubble packed by a pharmacist.
- Must include name, dosage, and administration schedule.
- Camp staff will only administer medication as directed by the prescribing physician.

Over-the-Counter Medications

- Camp stocks **common medications** (Tylenol, Benadryl, etc.).
- Parental permission is required to administer these (collected at drop-off).
- If your camper needs over-the-counter medication regularly, please send it in bubble pack form.
- Parents will always be called before any medication is given if permission was not granted at registration.

Lice Policy

All campers are checked for lice upon arrival. (Day and overnight campers)

O If lice (or evidence of lice) is found, campers must return home for treatment before coming back to camp.

Upon return, campers must pass another lice check, and all belongings must be washed and dried on high heat.

Illness Policy 🕮

To protect all campers, please **keep your camper home** if they have had:

- Fever, diarrhea, or vomiting within 48 hours before camp starts
- Symptoms of a contagious illness

If your camper develops **vomiting**, **diarrhea**, **or a high fever** at camp, they will be **sent home** and must be **symptom-free for 24 hours** before returning.

COVID-19 Protocol 😘

We take **COVID-19 precautions seriously** at camp.

If your camper tests positive for COVID-19, they must stay home or return home for 5 days from the positive test date.

If a camper misses camp due to COVID, a refund will be provided for the missed days. For more information on our full COVID-19 policy, please email info@camptamarack.ca.

Accidents, Illness & Emergencies 🚑

Our staff are trained to monitor for injury or illness.

If your camper needs medical care, we will:

Call you to discuss next steps, whether it's a doctor visit, hospital trip, or heading home to rest.

Ensure any camper with contagious symptoms (vomiting, diarrhea, high fever) returns home for 24 hours.

Behavior Expectations & Support 📤

Camp Tamarack is committed to **providing a safe, welcoming environment** for all campers.

Our #1 Policy: RESPECT

Campers are expected to:

- √ Show kindness and respect to others
- ✓ Follow camp expectations (which they help set at the start of the week)

✓ Work **cooperatively** with their cabin group and leaders

Our staff receive specialized training to guide campers using positive, age-appropriate strategies.

Behavior Support Process

- 1 Clear expectations are set by staff and campers together.
- 2 If a camper struggles to follow expectations, staff will provide support and guidance.
- [3] If challenges continue, parents will be contacted to create a behavior support plan.
- 4 If behavior does not improve and is **disrupting the camp experience for others**, the camper **may be sent**

Behaviors That May Result in Being Sent Home:

- Creating dangerous situations for themselves or others
- Stealing or vandalism
- Physical violence or verbal abuse
- Body shaming
- Leaving camp property without permission
- Racial, religious, or LGBTQ+ intolerance
- Sexual activity or misconduct
- Alcohol, illegal drugs, vaping, or marijuana use
- Repeated behavior that negatively affects others



If a camper is sent home for behavior reasons, no refund will be issued.

Campers with Additional Behavioral Needs

While we strive to **support all campers**, our staff are **not trained** to manage:

- Severe emotional or behavioral concerns
- **○** Violent behaviors
- Repeated violations of camp policies

If you have **concerns about your camper's needs**, please contact our **Director** at <u>director@camptamargack.ca</u> before camp begins. We are happy to **work with families to find the best fit for each camper**.

Keeping in Touch

Campers **love receiving letters and postcards!** Staying in touch can be a great way to **encourage** your camper while they're away.

Mail & Email

☑ Letters & Postcards

- Write often, but keep it positive! Avoid focusing on how much you miss them, pets, or home problems—this helps campers stay engaged in camp life.
- Mail is delivered daily after lunch.
- Pre-write letters and leave them with us at drop-off in a labeled envelope for scheduled delivery.

™ Email

- You can email your camper at <u>program@camptamarack.ca</u> (include their name in the subject line).
- Emails received **before noon** are delivered **the same day**; emails after noon are delivered **the next day**.

∠ Will My Camper Write Back?

- Some campers may write back, but **don't expect too many letters**—they're usually too busy having fun!
- If your camper writes an urgent letter, we may **scan and email it to you**, or you'll receive it at pick-up.

Photos & Updates

We use **SmugMug** to **upload and share photos** of camp life with families.

How It Works:

- The first full day of camp, we will send you an email with the link & password to access photos.
- Uploads begin at 9:00 pm each night but may take until morning to fully load.
- Photos are free to download!
- O Privacy Reminder: Please do not share photos of other children on social media—only your own camper's photos.

Phone Calls Home

We understand that **calling home** may be part of your **home loneliness plan**. If your camper **requests** to call home, they will be allowed to use the **camp landline or a staff member's phone**.

L How Calls Work:

- 1 A staff member will **call you first** to let you know your camper would like to talk.
- 2 Your camper will speak with you during a break in the schedule.
- 3 When the call is finished, the **staff member will check in with you again** to wrap up the conversation.

F Encouraging Independence

Our staff are trained to **support campers** in working through any challenges. Please **encourage your camper to talk to their Camp Leader** if they have concerns—this person is **there to help them**!

○ Please do not tell your camper they can call you anytime—this can make it harder for us to support them in a positive and successful way.

Checking In On Your Camper

- You are welcome to email our office to ask about your camper's experience!
- We typically return parent emails between 9:00 and 10:00 pm—
- If we need your support, we will call you about:
 - Behavioral concerns
 - Home loneliness
 - Forgotten comfort items (like a favorite stuffed animal!)

You know your child best, and we will work with you to ensure they have a fun and successful camp experience!

Visiting Camp **(School)**

We kindly ask that parents & guardians do not visit during the camp session. Your camper will have a better overall experience when fully immersed in camp life with their peers and staff.

Directions & Additional Policies

Getting to Camp

From North of Grande Prairie (via Hwy 40)

- 1 Head south on Hwy 40 toward Grande Prairie.
- 2 Cross the Wapiti River and, at the top of the hill, turn right (follow the highway signage).
- 3 Make an immediate left onto Range Road 62, heading north.
- 4 Pass the Camp Tamarack RV Park, then drive another 500 meters.
- 5 Turn right into our driveway and park in the large accessible parking area.

Missed the turn? If you see a sign for "A River Road Bed & Breakfast," you've gone too far! Turn around and drive south on Range Road 62—camp will now be on your left.

From Grande Prairie (via Hwy 40 South)

- 1 Head south on Hwy 40, leaving Grande Prairie.
- 2 At the traffic lights, turn left onto Road 668.
- 3 Make the very next right onto Range Road 62.
- 4 Drive to the end of the road—our driveway and sign will be on the left.
- 5 Turn in and park in the accessible area.
- Missed the turn? If you see KOA RV Park, you've gone too far! Turn around and head north on Range Road 62—camp will now be on your right.

From Grande Prairie (via Resources Road)

- 1 Head south on Resources Road.
- 2 At the 4-way lights outside Evergreen Park, turn right onto Road 668.
- 3 Continue driving until you reach Range Road 62 (last left turn) and turn left.
- [4] Drive south on Range Road 62 until you see our driveway and sign on the left.
- 5 Turn in and park in the accessible area.
- Missed the turn? If you see KOA RV Park, you've gone too far! Turn around and head north on Range Road 62—camp will now be on your right.

Additional Paperwork and Information



Certain camp programs require additional forms and waivers.
